Good Luck to California Chrome

Springboard Misses Top Three Finish by a Whisker

In his first race back in seven months. Springboard looked very competitive. Bret Calhoun had told jockey Miguel Mena to sit off the pace and give our colt a run in the stretch if he had it. After the race Miguel indicated that Springboard really wanted to be in race from the beginning and despite eating lots of dirt behind the leaders he did make a good run at the end, finishing fourth and narrowly missing third as shown in the photo finish.

Becoming racing fit is always a challenge until a horse is actually "racing." Springboard gained a lot of fitness and experience in this race and looked good while doing it. We would expect this race to make a good contribution to his racing career. Our colt did show signs of a minor shin issue coming out of the race so it will take a little time before we wheel him back, however, it looks like when given the chance he is ready to perform.

Featured Horse of the Month: Wright Flyer

Wright Flyer is a two-year-old with great promise that we are excited to have in the RCR

Stable. This colt is one of those unassuming yearling sales candidates that were purchased from the same Louisiana-hosted Yearling Sale that Vicar's in Trouble was plucked from at a value price a year earlier. We loved his pedigree and saw promise in this thin-chested almost awkward looking yearling. Purchased at a great value, we have been nothing but pleased with his growth and development as a two year old.



He is certainly the center on any equine basketball team, tall and long bodied. He handled Spring training very well and has just continued to get bigger and broader. So much so, that we felt he needed some time to grow into his large frame and we have turned him out to "just be a horse" for 60-90 days. His low dosage profile, and long-striding build, would normally point to a two-turn horse and we won't see many of those racing opportunities for two-year-olds until later in the year.

His pedigree shows class with the Kingmambo sired Student Council on top and an Honour and Glory mare on the bottom. Student Council earned more than \$1.5MM on the race track, most of it later in his racing career and around two turns. Wright Flyer's dam, Snap To It, was a \$140,000 yearling purchase but never showed much on the race track. However, as a broodmare she has proven herself with three stakes performing foals out of six horses of racing age. Snappy Girl, a full sister to

Wright Flyer, was stakes-placed at two and has won back-to-back stakes as a three year old. In less than 12 months of racing, she has earned more than \$206,000 on the track.

This colt represents a price point and value offering that we have rarely offered. As a Louisiana-bred, he is eligible for several restricted races with respectable purses. If you are looking to own a racehorse with the potential to take flight...Wright Flyer might be just the one, click here to

Divine Decree Fires in First Recorded Work

We made a decision to ship Divine Decree up to Lone Star Park about four weeks earlier than planned to get a good look at her progress and to try to determine where her talent level is before it gets hot in Texas. After a non-eventful ship and a week of moving on the track, she recorded her

first official work of 2014 on Thursday morning. Our filly posted the 2nd best work of 10, covering four furlongs in 48 seconds flat. A pretty impressive and very sharp first work. Time Catcher Training at Twin Oaks

Our Temple City Colt is training well. He is two-minute-licking at Twin Oaks Training Center and will soon start

breezing. His half sister, Perplexity, coming off a Maiden win followed by an Allowance level second place was entered in a \$75,000 Stakes race but chose to scratch out of the race. Clearly this family continues to perform.





Slew City Lou Ships to Lone Star Park

Slew City Lou arrived last Saturday at Lone Star Park. She is still several weeks away from being race ready, but we wanted to get her back in the on-track environment. She was sent out Thursday with the intention of posting a very easy first work and covered four furlongs in an easy 51.0 seconds. She is looking good and as Eddie Milligan handed

her off he said, "I don't think she has lost any of the talent she had when she left the track in December." When she last left the track she was a winner, let's hope she returns in the same form.

Medal of Courage Training Well in Florida

Paul Sharpe has a man crush on our Warrior's Reward Colt, and right fully so. This horse is handsome. He was impressive a few months ago, but he just keeps developing in all the right ways. As Paul puts it, "he has a well-defined angular shoulder, a beautiful hip, a very long

body, and is ripped with muscle." Thus far he looks to have a very high and maintainable cruising speed with an ability to produce a kick when asked. That combination can lead to a lot of wins late in the two-year-old racing season. We are pretty excited about his progress and he will most likely ship to Kentucky in about 4-5 weeks. He is currently stretching out to four furlong breezes and

doing gate work. We thought we may need to geld him because of his size, but he appears to be growing into it well...exciting stuff.

The industry is frothy with excitement over these Warrior's Reward Two-Year-Olds. Coming out of the juvenile sales season most thought they looked like two-turn later developing horses. On May 31st, that all changed when the first three Warrior's Reward offspring were entered into their very first Maiden Special Weight Races and all three came up away with wins. Wow. Proving to be a durable, consistent performer Sassy Kiss is ready to run. We thought we might get an opportunity on a 15-day turn out of her last May 16th winning effort to run again, however, the race opportunities failed to fill. Currently it looks like she will return in mid-June. Bret Calhoun loves the way this filly continues to stay sharp and shiny. He sent her out for a four furlong maintenance work and she didn't disappoint, producing a respectable four furlongs in 50.00 flat.
