Impressive Athletic Colt Relocating To Calhoun Stable

Rikkit Tikki Taxi (RTT), our two-year-old colt by Wilburn is in his final two weeks of gate works at Twin Oaks Training Center and will then be shipping to the race track. According to Eddie Milligan, the colt will be a good one for us, the question is simply "how good?" RTT was a tall,

monster of a yearling for a late April baby, and has filled out nicely. The most remarkable part is he is STILL growing. He could be a man among boys when mixed in with his fellow two year olds and we are pretty excited to see him racing later this summer.

Rikki Tikki Taxi Represents Good Value

RTT is by sire Wilburn. He is a first crop sire without a flashy reputation.

However, he is grand looking, won five of nine on the track including the Indiana Derby, and attracted 120 mares in 2014. Many in the industry



think he will really deliver as a sire. Our colt is by a Dixie Union sired mare who won more than \$115,000 on the track. His second dam was a Graded Stakes winner of more than \$290,000 and the third dam, a multiple stakes winner of more than \$200,000. So there is some racing class supporting this athletic colt. How determined is he? How big is his heart? Does he have the will and desire to compete? Those are always the big guestions, but I wouldn't bet against this one.

Slew City Lou to compete in \$100,000 Louisiana Legends Distaff Stakes on Saturday

Slew City Lou has been a consistent performer around two-turns as of late. With the heavy hitters out of this stakes race, it looked like a



spot where our filly could have a shot. There are eight other Louisiana-bred fillies entered to compete in the race and any in the top half have a shot at winning it. Our filly will depart July 4th from the seventh post at 8:49 CST with jockey Roberto Morales on board. Morales is winning at a 19% rate and has put Slew City Lou in first and second during his last two rides. Good luck to Lou and her owners.

Perplexity to Race Friday Night at Lone Star Park

Perplexity failed to impress going short on the turf last out. However, to be fair to our filly, she really is not built to be a turf sprinter. We knew it before the race, but had waited nearly two months for an opportunity and

just became impatient. She is best built for a dirt performance in the 6-7 furlong range. That said an opportunity presented itself to compete at 7.5 furlongs on turf at Lone Star Park on July 3rd at 8:55 CST in Race 6. Drawing post position #4 she is ridden by Cliff Berry. As frequently as races have come off the turf at Lone Star PArk this meet, we hoped for a little weather luck, but unfortunately it looks like things will remain dry and this filly will stay on the turf. She is the pre-race fourth choice at 6-1. Good luck to her owners.

Time Catcher Fails to Show Up on Dirt

The perils of having a turf horse is that often the rain will come and the race will slide to an alternate dirt surface. Such was the case Saturday night when Time Catcher was entered for a mile on turf at Lone Star Park. While



the day was sunny and bright, the rain the night before had saturated the turf to the point that the race was moved to dirt. Unfortunately, the betting public did not get the message and pushed his odds to 6-to-5 as the betting favorite. Bret Calhoun's riding instructions to Cliff Berry, a simple "God Bless You." Time Catcher finished fifth. We re-affirmed our belief that he might be able to run on sealed dirt, but not a fast, sandy track. We will hope for a warm day on the grass next out.
