Will California Chrome be the One?



With the Kentucky Derby and Preakness tucked away in his back pocket, does California Chrome have the potential to be the first Triple Crown Winner in 36 years? I am going to say "Yes!" Sure as a thoroughbred owner, we all dream of it being one of ours, but as a fan of the sport I don't care...one of ours, one of theirs, it does not matter, just be the one. The time is right for horse racing to get some positive attention and California Chrome

would be a great representative Triple Crown Winner. Here exists a horse of modest breeding, affordable at the lower end of the sport's price range, that has simply been a dream maker for two couples that fell in love with involvement in thoroughbred racing.

His owners, are not unlike many Royal Colors Racing Owners. Two couples that "dipped their toe in the water" as fractional owners of five percent each in a filly, ended up taking ownership of that horse near the end of her racing career and decided to turn her into a broodmare. Flash forward four years and her first offspring, California Chrome, sits on the edge of

history. They turned down \$6,000,000 for 50% of him prior to his even winning the Santa Anita Derby! Why? Most likely because they wanted the horse trained by their trainer, wearing their silks, and to be the owners of the next Kentucky Derby winner. It is great to see dreams come true. I like it, and hope we see the first Triple Crown Winner since 1978 in two weeks.



Sassy Kiss Wins for Fourth Time

Sassy Kiss returned to the winner's circle for her fourth time in 11 starts and pushed her winnings to \$94,000+. Our filly raced on her current home track, Churchill Downs, on May 16th and won by four lengths in a six furlong contest. She broke poorly on the rail, but surged forward to establish a stalking position. As the field turned for the stretch, jockey Robby Albarado could wait no longer and pushed Sassy forward. She looked good

crossing the finish line with ears pricked and more in the gas tank.

Trainer Bret Calhoun felt that she was coming off some tough races against strong competition and needed a chance to regain her confidence. While she had been competitive in those, she needed the mental boost of the win. We picked the right spot and were happy to see our filly do her part to the benefit of her partners. Returning to run in good form at Churchill Downs in the month of May, however, is still great.

Springboard will compete again at six furlongs in a field of eight three-year-olds. While all are pursuing the second win of their racing careers, several in this group are stand out performers with stakes and graded stakes placings in their background. This race will be tough. I view it as a great reward if he finishes on top, but after a seven month layoff he may need the race to be at top form. He most certainly will not be sent off as the favorite, so if you are a betting fan, he might present opportunity. If you wish to watch the race, it is race 4 at 2:45 p.m. CST and he is horse number 3.
